### Arts and PE

Create a model of a mode of transport that you might explore the world in. It could be a rocket ship, boat, plane, hot air balloon...

Create a simple daily exercise routine using two or more activities, e.g. 10 star jumps followed by 5 push-ups. Can you add more moves each time?

How many star jumps can you complete in 1 minute? Set a timer and see if you can beat your score every day!

### Mind-set

Think of two or three things that you want to learn this year and draw a picture of each one. How will you achieve your goals?
